- **Car Parking.** First pickup will always be from the **Old Gasworks Car Park (Brook Street)**. **This pickup is set at 25 minutes before the scheduled trip departure** time shown in the brochure. **The driver will wait a maximum of 5 minutes.** This allows us to get to New Street around 15 minutes before departure, giving time for the remaining passengers to arrive and board the bus. **Before** departing the venue for your return to Daventry, please discuss with your driver where you require dropping off i.e. Bus Station (especially if you have bus connections to get back for), Old Gasworks Car Park, or near to where you live if in Daventry. Please don't assume the driver will know.
- **Accessibility:** For those passengers that use wheelchairs or have mobility issues - If you have any concerns regarding accessibility we would request that you contact the venue and talk to them directly, or access their website. We can assist in providing contact numbers if necessary.
- **If you want a travel scooter for a trip you can always hire one from DACT Mobility. We do ask you to talk to the office first, to make sure we have the right type of bus available. (N.B. Some venues do provide Scooters making it unnecessary to take your own. Ask the DACT Office if you need more details)**
- **Cancellations:** These can affect a lot of people and it may result in trips being cancelled due to insufficient numbers or members losing the opportunity to get group rate entry or trips run at a loss to DACT. Please understand that to be fair to all our members we have to be consistent in applying our 7-day cancellation policy. **(see back page)**
- **Any feedback on our trips, positive or negative, is very important to us.** We do make changes based on feedback, so please telephone or call in to the office.
- **PLEASE DO NOT ASK YOUR VOLUNTEER DRIVER TO MAKE ANY DROP-OFFS TO ANY VILLAGES OUTSIDE OF DAVENTRY ON RETURN FROM THE TRIP. DRIVERS OFTEN HAVE OTHER RESPONSIBILITIES FOLLOWING RETURN FROM THE TRIP AND DACT HAS NOT ACCOUNTED FOR ANY ADDITIONAL MILES IN THE COSTING OF THE TRIP.**

Sun 1 <sup>st</sup>	Chester	Historic Town	9am	Leave Chester 4pm	£28	Chester is a beautiful walled city that has the oldest racecourse and the largest Roman Amphitheatre in Britain, plus a 1000-year-old Cathedral with reportedly Europe's finest example of medieval carvings and the 700-year-old Rows galleries for those who love to shop. There is also a vibrant café culture. You can also explore the city aboard an open top hop on hop off bus tour.
Wed 4 <sup>th</sup>	RHS Wisley Garden Show, Surrey	Gardens	9am	3pm	£19	This is the weekend of the Wisley Flower Show. Wisley is the flagship garden of the RHS with a rose garden with over 400 roses and 500 herbaceous plants, rock garden, alpine display house and state-of-the-art greenhouse with 3 climatic zones. A lot to see. <b>ENTRY: Adult £12.50 (for 10 passengers+)</b>
Fri 6 <sup>th</sup>	Shrewsbury, Shrops	Historic Town	10am	3.30pm	£17	A delightful jumble of winding medieval streets and timbered Tudor houses leaning at precarious angles, Shrewsbury was a crucial front in the conflict between the English and the Welsh in medieval days. Even today, the road bridge running east towards London is known as the English Bridge to mark it out from the Welsh Bridge leading northwest towards Holyhead. Shrewsbury is also the birthplace of Charles Darwin. There are great places to eat and shop as well.
Sat 7 <sup>th</sup>	Stoke Bruerne 1940s weekend, Northants	Themed Canal Visit	10.45am	3.30pm	£9	The Stoke Bruerne Village at War weekend is on its 10 <sup>th</sup> year and has established itself as one of the most popular and successful World War Two re-enactment events in Britain. Most of the funds raised at this event continue to support the ongoing success of the museum. There is a variety of entertainment and activity going on throughout the two days. This includes plenty of singing, an Air Raid Experience, Memorabilia & Wedding Dress Exhibition, Afternoon Tea Dances, Fashion Parades, Battle Re-enactments and Military & Vintage Vehicles. <b>ENTRY: Adult £10 (£8 for 15 passengers+)</b>
Mon 9 <sup>th</sup>	International Bird of Prey Centre, Gloucs	Special Interest	9.30am	3pm	£17	The centre was first opened to the public on May 25 <sup>th</sup> 1967 as a family business by Philip Glasier, a very well-known falconer of his time. It was the only dedicated bird of prey centre in the UK at the time and just one of two in the world at that time, the other being in Germany. Today with more than 250 incredible birds of prey it's the UK's biggest bird of prey centre, with 12 acres of enclosures, glorious gardens, field and woods to explore. It also has a lovely café for light lunches and drinks as well as spectacular flying displays throughout the day. <b>ENTRY: £12 Concessions &amp; £10 Adults. (£1 discount on both prices for 10 or more passengers)</b>
Wed 11 <sup>th</sup>	Peak District Tour	Peak District Tour	9.30am	5.30pm in Dav	£18	Mini-tour of the Peak District with its beautiful scenery and picturesque small towns. <b>Approx return time, traffic dependent.</b>
Thurs 12 <sup>th</sup>	Cottesbrooke Hall, Northants	House & Gardens	1.30pm	Leave venue 4.30pm	£9	A wonderful Queen Anne house dating from 1702, set in delightful award-winning gardens in rural Northamptonshire. The Hall is the much-loved family home of the Macdonald-Buchanan family and lived in every day. With some exceptional family portraits, the contents include excellent 18th century English and French furniture. The chief distinction of the house, however, is the superb collection of Sporting Art evident throughout and known as the Woolavington Collection. The Laundry is where you can taste homemade cakes and a drink. <b>ENTRY: £9 including a tour of the Hall.</b>
Tues 17 <sup>th</sup>	Nottingham, River Trent, Princess River Cruise	Princess River Cruise	10am	3.30pm	£15	Weather and river traffic permitting, the 3-hour cruise incorporates the interest of working locks and glorious countryside as the boat makes its way between the outskirts of Nottingham and Stoke Bardolph. All cruises have a full catering service; try the renowned Navigator Dinner a choice of chicken, fish or scampi with apple pie and custard to <b>follow</b> and complimentary tea or coffee. All meals are served to your table with a generous helping of hospitality. Informative live commentary and a companion cruise map are also included so that you can follow your journey and pick out the historical and local points of interest. <b>ENTRY: Adult £18.50</b>
Wed 18 <sup>th</sup>	Grimsthorpe Castle, Lincs	Castle & Grounds	10.30am	3.30pm	£15	Grimsthorpe Castle sits amongst rolling Lincolnshire countryside surrounded by gardens designed by Capability Brown, extensive historic woodland and a 50-acre lake. Enjoy the chance to soak up the atmosphere in a Castle that has been home to the same family since 1516 and is filled with fine furniture, paintings and tapestries. There is a tea-room that serves afternoon tea, with homemade cakes and a range of hot and cold drinks. If you are feeling particularly energetic there is a cycle hire shop to enable you to cycle miles of traffic free tracks and trails in the park. The castle was also used during the First and Second World Wars by various parts of the Air Force. <b>ENTRY: £12 Concessions &amp; £13 Adults. (£11 for 15 or more passengers)</b>
Thurs 19 <sup>th</sup>	Hunstanton, Norfolk	Seaside	9am	Leave H'ton 4.30pm	£23	Very popular bustling east coast seaside resort with expansive sandy beaches, funfair, attractions and fish & chips!
Tues 24 <sup>th</sup>	Springfields, Spalding	Shopping	10.30am	3.15pm	£15	Springfield is an out of town centre in Spalding. It has a Garden Centre plus a number of shops (approx 55 in total) that include an M&S Outlet, Hotters, Designer Warehouse Outlet, Klass etc. In addition it has its 25 acre Festival Gardens that are free to explore.
Thurs 26 <sup>th</sup>	Guide Dog Training Centre, Warks	Special Interest	11am	2.30pm	£10	This is an opportunity to take a tour to see how the dogs are trained at the National Guide Dog Training School in Leamington Spa. Meet the dogs and their handlers (and take pictures), learn more about sight loss, being partially sighted or blind and browse the gift shop. Some refreshments will be provided. <b>Entry plus the tour (approx 2 hours), is free</b>
Sat 28 <sup>th</sup>	Malvern Autumn Show, Worcs	Garden Show	9am	3pm	£15	RHS annual flower show held at the Three Counties Showground, at the foot of the Malvern Hills. Show includes flower marquee, floral art, plant pavilions, show gardens, retail outlets and talks and demonstrations from a number of TV gardeners. There is also the Linden Suite Restaurant serving anything from a 3 course lunch to afternoon tea. <b>ENTRY: Adults £18</b>

<b>Mon 30<sup>th</sup></b>	Nene Valley Railway, Cambs	Flying Scotsman	07.30am	4pm	£17	The Flying Scotsman 60103 is making an entrance at Wansford Station, Nene Valley Railway and the locomotive will be in public service for 3 running days. You will have a chance to ride on board this iconic locomotive. <b>Tickets are £30. After booking, any cancellations will incur the full cost with no exceptions.</b>

Tues 1 <sup>st</sup>	Packwood House, Warks	House & Gardens	10.30am	3pm	£11	The culmination of a lifetime of dreams: salvaged objects & exotic pieces come together in a Jacobean meets Edwardian style. The house was originally built in the 16 <sup>th</sup> -C, yet its interiors were extensively restored between the 1 <sup>st</sup> & 2 <sup>nd</sup> World Wars by Graham Baron Ash to create a fascinating 20th-C evocation of domestic Tudor architecture.Packwood House contains a fine collection of 16th-C textiles and furniture, and the gardens have renowned herbaceous borders and a famous collection of yews.You can treat yourself to lunch, a delicious slice of cake or a hot drink at the Kitchen Garden Café. <b>ENTRY: Adults £6, with our National Trust special rate.</b>
Fri 4 <sup>th</sup>	Ironbridge, Blists Hill Victorian Town Shrops	Museum	9.30am	3pm	£18	Blists Hill is the most popular part of the Ironbridge Gorge Museums. Experience the sights, sounds, smells and tastes of a recreated Victorian Town covering 52 acres. Life is re-enacted by townsfolk who wear the dress of the day and go about their lives in the shops and workplaces of this authentic Victorian community. Visit the Victorian Pharmacy, the Fried Fish Dealer, Dressmaker, the Mine and Blast Furnace and much more. Plenty of options to eat and drink including fish & chips, pies and pasties from the Butchers and treats from the Bakery. <b>ENTRY: Adults £14, Concessions £11.50 (10 passengers or more)</b>
Sun 6 <sup>th</sup>	Statfold Narrow Gauge Trust, Tamworth	Railway	9.30am	3pm	£13	The Statfold Barn Railway is an extensive two-foot gauge private railway near Tamworth in Staffordshire, England. It is home to one of the largest collections of narrow gauge historic steam, diesel and electric locomotives from the UK and overseas. This weekend relive the 1940's with live history display, a Tiger moth flyover & much more. Arrive in 1940's dress and receive 10% off entrance cost. There are food vans serving hot foods and Diane's Diner inside the museum serving hot and cold drinks, sandwiches, crisps, cakes & more. <b>ENTRY: Adults £12.50 at the gate. (you can book a ticket in advance online for £10)</b>
Mon 7 <sup>th</sup>	Evesham Garden Centre, Evesham Country Park Worcs	Garden Centre	10.30am	3pm	£13	Set in the beautiful surroundings of the fabulous shopping and leisure destination, The Valley in Worcestershire, at Evesham Garden Centre they stock a wide range of trees, plants and shrubs together with furniture, alfresco dining solutions and gift ideas. We also have our very own Apple Barn Restaurant, offering a carvery, lunches and snacks. With the country park & Eversham Vale light railway it's a great day out for all the family.
Wed 9 <sup>th</sup>	Mystery Tour	Scenic Tour	10am	5.30pm in Dav	£14	Mystery tour typically following scenic routes through villages and countryside with stops for morning and afternoon refreshments, lunch and browsing. These trips are often a "taster" for other Days Out. <b>Approx return time, traffic dependent.</b>
Mon 14 <sup>th</sup>	Kedleston Hall, Derbys	House & Gardens	9.45am	3.30pm	£15	Take a trip back in time to the 1760s at this spectacular Neo-classical mansion framed by historic parkland. Designed for lavish entertaining and displaying an extensive collection of paintings, sculpture and original furnishings, Kedleston is a stunning example of the work of architect Robert Adam. The Curzon family have lived here since the 12th-century and continue to live at the Hall. Lord Curzon's Eastern Museum is a treasure trove of fascinating objects acquired on his travels in Asia and while Viceroy of India (1899 to 1905). The Hall was used as a key location for 'The Duchess', the Hollywood blockbuster starring Keira Knightley. <b>ENTRY: Adults £8, with our National Trust special rate.</b>
Wed 16 <sup>th</sup>	National Space Centre, Leicester	Special Interest	10.15am	3pm	£14	This museum & educational resource covers the fields of space science & astronomy, along with a space research programme in partnership with the University of Leicester. Many of the exhibits are interactive, including an opportunity to experience a look through our solar system, a mock up of the Columbus Module and free standing rockets. <b>Entry: £15 Adults &amp; £12 Concessions</b>
Mon 21 <sup>st</sup>	Kew Gardens, London	Gardens	9am	3.00pm	£21	Kew Gardens is a UNESCO World heritage site. The gardens date back to the 1700s. Kew covers an area of 326 acres and includes lakes, extensive walkways, themed area and a number of glasshouses housing a wide array of temperate plants and trees. <b>With our excellent agreement with Kew we are able to offer this trip at a total cost of £21.00 (Bus and entry combined).</b>
Fri 25 <sup>th</sup>	Stamford, Lincs	Historic Town	10am	3pm	£15	Market day in Stamford, a small Lincolnshire market town famous for its' Lincolnshire stone buildings. It has narrow streets and courtyards with specialist shops & boutiques in addition to the larger high street shops. Close by is the River Welland with a park area where you can walk or just sit. The popular market spreads through the town centre streets selling a wide range of products.
Tues 29 <sup>th</sup>	Crocodiles of the World & Burford, Oxon	Special Interest	10am	3.30pm	£14	Come face-to-face with some of the world's most feared predators in a fun, safe and stimulating environment. With under-water viewing, talks, animal encounters and feeds throughout the day there's plenty to keep you occupied at the UK's only Crocodile Zoo. From critically endangered Siamese crocodiles from Cambodia, to Chinese alligators, Nile crocodiles, American alligators & caiman, as well as meerkats, otters, Giant tortoises and laughing Kookaburras. This is one of only four zoos in the UK where you can see a Komodo dragon, the King of the Lizards. <b>ENTRY: Adults £9, Concessions £8</b> Once we have had our fill of crocodiles we will move on to the beautiful town of Burford for the rest of our trip out.
Wed 30 <sup>th</sup>	Old Barracks Visitor Centre, Heart of England & Heart of the Shires, Northants	Food & Place of Interest	10.30am	2.30pm	£8	First visit of the day will be to the Depot Visitors Centre in Weedon, once known as The Royal Ordnance Depot, built as a secure place to store equipment, ammunition and weapons for use by the British Army. The Depot fulfilled its function from the Napoleonic Wars through to the end of National Service and serviced every major conflict in-between. Access to the complex was strictly controlled, and the work carried out inside was kept secret. The striking Georgian footprint of the site, with its perimeter wall, bastions, storehouses, powder magazines and gatehouses, was complete by 1810. <b>ENTRY: FREE.</b> After this we will head to the Heart of England Pub in Weedon for lunch before finishing the day at The Heart of the Shires shopping village set around a Victorian courtyard.
Thurs 31 <sup>st</sup>	RAF Duxford, Cambs	Aircraft Museum	10am	3.30pm	£17	Duxford has a large collection of civil and military aircraft through the ages. This includes Concorde (you can walk through), Spitfires & Hurricanes, Flying Fortress, Lancaster, Vulcan. They are spread across a number of hangars, including a Battle of Britain hangar and the impressive and newly renovated American hangar. In addition, the Land Warfare hangar houses one of the finest exhibitions of

						tanks, military vehicles and artillery in the country. For those that need it a mobility vehicle should be operating to move people around the site. <b>ENTRY: Adult £14,</b>

Wed 6 <sup>th</sup>	Milestones, Basingstoke	Museum	9.30am	3.30pm	£17	Immerse yourself in the past at Milestones, Hampshire's museum of living history. Explore the museum's streets, shops and buildings to discover how people used to live, buy a ration of sweets from our 1940s sweet shop, view our unique collection of vintage vehicles and have a go in our penny arcade! Your trip to Hampshire past will take you as far back as the age of the Victorians, with cobbled streets, a replica Victorian school room – complete with chalkboard and teacher's desk – and even a working printing press. From a working pub, costumed characters, interactive displays and a café that offers a selection of hot meals and light bites, from traditional fish and chips to jacket potatoes, home-made soup and freshly-made sandwiches, ice creams and cakes. <b>ENTRY: Adults £15, Concessions £13 (Adults &amp; Concessions £10 for 15 or more passengers)</b>

Tues 12 <sup>th</sup>	Rushden Lakes, Northants	Shopping	10.30am	3pm	£10	Rushden Lakes will become your first-choice destination for shopping. Recognised as one of the best in Europe with its unique location, high quality exhibitors and bustling atmosphere. Wonderful Christmas gifts, decorations and festive foods can be found in abundance. <b>ENTRY: FREE</b>

You will be asked for your full name, address, date of birth and contact details (including mobile phone number if you have one). If you have any mobility difficulties, please notify us. (e.g. you perhaps need to bring a tri-walker on a trip)

#### Points to note:

- Booking will be on a first-come first served basis. For trips that are fully booked we will run a reserve list and contact people on that list if seats become available through cancellations.
- There are **NO** age restrictions applicable to DACT Days Out, but unfortunately all seats are charged at the same rate. This also applies to carers of wheelchair passengers etc.
- Price quoted is for return travel only. Admission charges **are not** included, unless otherwise stated. Food, drink, etc. is excluded.
- Payment in cash should be made to the driver on the day of the trip unless stated otherwise.
- Pick-ups The bus will leave from the Old Gasworks Car Park/Daventry Bus Station at the time stated in trip details. **We will wait a maximum of 5 minutes only, in fairness to other passengers.**
- **Drop offs - Before departing the venue for your return to Daventry, please discuss with your driver where you require to be dropped off i.e. Bus Station, Old Gasworks Car Park, or near to where you live if in Daventry. Please don't assume the driver will know.**
- DACT will do their best to make sure every trip operates as advertised. However in circumstances beyond our control or minimum numbers not being met, we may have to change or cancel – we cannot run these trips at a loss to DACT. All timings are subject to traffic conditions and can be beyond our control and may affect your onward journey, such as public transport to your home.
- Trip Information is obtained from a variety of sources. We try to give a fair summary of a destination but we cannot guarantee that all the content we may use is totally accurate.
- **Trolleys.** We can carry shopping trolleys but they must be booked in advance as there is only limited storage space on our buses.
- ***CANCELLATIONS. Please be aware that if you cancel your booking late, you may prevent others from travelling on the trip who would otherwise have been able to go, and also if buses then get insufficient numbers, they run the risk of being cancelled. Please only book if you definitely intend to travel. All bookings are taken on trust without a deposit and we do not want to change this procedure to avoid heavy administration. You must give at least one weeks notice to cancel your trip, i.e. on the same day of the week one week earlier than trip date otherwise it will incur the full trip cost; (no exceptions); it is unfair to other passengers to have their trip cancelled at short notice due to late cancellations. Please pay to the DACT Office as soon as possible.***
