

BARBY & KILSBY CHURCHES' NEWS

DURING TRINITY - JULY 2017

If you've taken a stroll up Church Walk in Kilsby in the last couple of weeks you will have noticed that the church tower is covered in scaffolding. Is it falling down? Is it being taken down? These are questions we pondered at a recent assembly in school. Should the building be demolished? Or a new church built? Were ideas I proposed. All but one of the youngsters were of the view that the church was important, should stay, and should be repaired. That is the intention: Work should begin soon, once a close-up inspection has taken place and matching stone located. We hear the phrase 'preserved for future generations' often enough, here was the up and coming generation saying 'yes' to that.

We have a past, a history, a culture, to care for and pass on. The responsibility for that in 2017 is ours. The materials and labour for

the task are expensive, but can we put a price on our identity, as a people, a nation, a village community? Please give to this work of preservation, if you are able.

Barby School have just put on a production of 'Shakespeare Rocks', a musical bringing together the words of 'the Bard' and contemporary music to tell his story. I saw the dress rehearsal, they made a great job of it. There's some talent there. Again, it was about valuing the past and enjoying our heritage. It was also about the past being the inspiration for further creativity; the old sparking the new; the energy in life evolving new but complementary forms.

These words from the past invite us to join in that evolving creativity...

Congratulations to **Rev Dawn Stokes**, Assistant Curate at Holy Cross, Daventry, who was Ordained Priest on Saturday 24th June at Peterborough Cathedral. Dawn isn't leaving us though; she will be at Holy Cross, as Assistant Curate, for another 2 years.

A bit more about the new service 'menu'...

Holy Communion 'sung' is once a month at each church; at Barby that means 'with hymns'; at Kilby it means 'with hymns' and with a sung setting of the Communion, which is led by the choir.

Holy Communion 'said' is a quieter, more reflective service, with a simpler form of words, held once a month in each church. At Barby a Nave Altar is used, and at Kilsby we use the Lady Chapel.

Morning Worship follows the seasonal format of '*Common Worship : Daily Prayer*' (see comment below). It is easy to follow through from a single sheet and a hymn book.

Everyone is welcome to any or all of these services. Refreshments are often served after the service if you would like to stay and chat. If you would like to find out about Baptism or Confirmation, or just find out more about Christian faith, see Rev Nigel contact details on the back cover). The Communion services cater for Gluten Free. (Please inform a Welcomer when you arrive.)

I was chatting to someone the other day about 'The Book of Common Prayer'. Back in the day it was the sole resource for worship. Great, everything in one book! Now all our services here are from 'Common Worship', a collection of umpteen different books. That's why we have sheets for our services. Of that collection though, I would recommend '*Common Worship : Daily Prayer*' (pictured above, ISBN 0715120735 or 0715121006, available for about £20). A very useable book, with prayers and psalms for every day. Finding your way around it takes a bit of time, but it's worth it. If you get stuck I can give a hand. Alternatively, there is a cost free 'app' '*Daily Prayer*' available that takes you to the right form of prayer, at the right time, of the right day, with all the readings in place! But perhaps it's helpful to be phone phree phor prayer? - Rev Nigel
