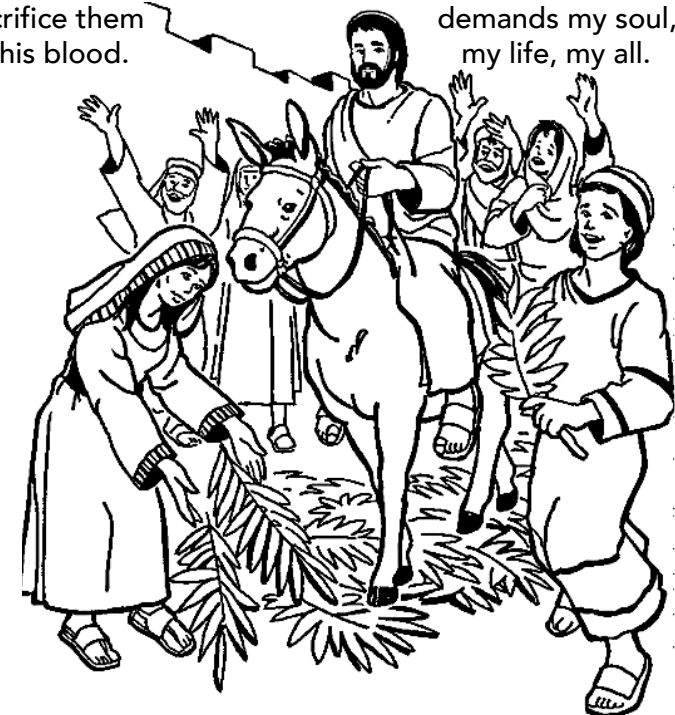


When I survey
