Parish Council News (From the Parish Clerk 01788 891184)

The next meeting of Barby & Onley Parish Council will take place on **MONDAY 11th MARCH 2019 at 7.30pm** in **BARBY** Village Hall, Kilsby Road, Barby. CV23 8TT

Members of the Parish are welcome to attend, and the first 20 minutes of the meeting will be open for public participation. If you have a concern which you would like to make the Parish Councillors aware of, then come along and let them know about it. It may not be possible to provide an answer immediately, but the matter can be put on the agenda for the following meeting.

Speedwatch - Thank you to the group of volunteers who gave up their time to man the Speedwatch equipment last year. Following on from Speedwatch, the Police have been able to bring their mobile speed camera to the village on a couple of occasions to assist with slowing of the traffic. We have signed up to take part in the Speedwatch initiative again for the weeks beginning 29th June, 13th July and 27th July. We need volunteers to work in a group of 3 people for an early morning or evening time slot over the 3 allocated weeks. Training is given on how to use the speed gun. The Annual Parish Meeting of the Parish Council will take place on **MONDAY 29th APRIL 2019** at 7.30pm in Barby Village Hall. Although this meeting is led by the Chairperson of the Parish Council it is not a Parish Council meeting but a meeting for all residents of the Parish where any organisation is welcome to come along and give a report of their activities over the past year. Please come along if you would like to let the village know what your group has been up to. We hope that our County Councillor will be able to provide us with an update on what is happening in Northamptonshire County Council and to explain the effects of unitary change on the Parish Council. We are also going to have a presentation on Rural Housing Surveys and how the District Council work out the levels of housing needed in the parishes.

Unlicensed Waste Operators - Please check that any waste collection company that offers to take away waste for you holds a licence, or you could be fined up to £400 for using an unlicensed operator. If someone offers to take away rubbish for a very cheap price, then the offer is probably too good to be true, and your rubbish will end up dumped in an unauthorised place.

Our local MP reports on progress being made on unauthorised encampments - Since first becoming an MP it has become apparent that one subject in particular causes widespread unease amongst my constituents, that of travellers. I am very aware of these long-standing concerns and I have always taken various steps both locally and nationally to try and address these.

Let me be clear, I will always take the side of residents and locals on such matters.

Recently there have been an increasing number of unauthorised encampments in and around Daventry.

However, the Government has recently published a response to a consultation on this subject, which will take forward a comprehensive range of measures.

These include, but are in no way limited to, consulting on:

- Extending police powers to tackle trespassers, for example, permitting the police to direct trespassers to suitable authorised sites located in neighbouring local authority areas
- Considering a new criminal trespass offence
- Additional support for local authority enforcement activities, for example, addressing issues around the clean-up costs which can occur following an unauthorised encampment
- Further reforms to the planning system to tackle unauthorised development and encampments

I trust that the above proposals provide some level of reassurance to those concerned that this Government is taking a pro-active and tough approach to this serious matter.
