## **Parish Council News** (From the Parish Clerk 01788 891184)

The next meeting of Barby & Onley Parish Council (this is the AGM of the Parish Council) will take place on **MONDAY 13<sup>th</sup> MAY 2019 at 7.30pm** in Barby Village Hall, Kilsby Road, Barby. CV23 8TT. This meeting is when the council elects its Chairman for the coming year. Members of the Parish are welcome to attend, and the first 20 minutes of the meeting will be open for public participation. If you have a concern which you would like to make the Parish Councillors aware of, then come along and let them know about it. It may not be possible to provide an answer immediately, but the matter can be put on the agenda for the following meeting.

**ANNUAL PARISH MEETING** This will take place on Monday 29<sup>th</sup> April 2019 at 7.30pm in Barby Village Hall.

Although this meeting is chaired by the Chairman of the Parish Council it is not a Parish Council meeting but a meeting for all residents of the Parish where any organisation is welcome to come along and give a report of their activities over the past year.

Our County Councillor (Malcolm Langley) is due to tell about the financial status of the County Council and what the next steps will be for Northamptonshire, our District Councillor and Parish Council.

A representative from the District Council will explain why our "Rural Housing Survey" needs an update and how and why it is carried out.

We should also hear from a representative of Leam Valley voluntary community first responder's (CFR). They have been requested by West Midlands Ambulance Service (WMAS) to establish a new group known as Leam Valley CFRs, predominantly to serve the many villages within the Leam Valley area. As Barby is on the Warwickshire/Northamptonshire border and WMAS have a reciprocal cross border agreement with East Midlands Ambulance Service, on occasion and when the need arises, they are tasked with calls out to villages in Northamptonshire.

**VILLAGE LITTER PICK** - Thanks to those of you who helped in the spring clean litter pick in Barby on Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> March. We collected a large pile of bin bags full of rubbish. We hope to have a second clean-up day later in the year.

**POTHoles** - The County Council is responsible for the highway, so any potholes need to be reported to them, as they will only come and fix them if they are made aware of them. All members of the public can report potholes but the system for doing so has changed and been simplified. **Fix My Street** - Northamptonshire County Council (NCC) has closed down Street Doctor and moving everything over to a new system called **Fix My Street**. Current reports have been moved over so they shouldn't have to be resubmitted and the old report reference numbers should still work. Fix My Street is simpler to use and mobile responsive and it allows photos to be attached to reports. The new system will be available via links at [www.northamptonshire.gov.uk](http://www.northamptonshire.gov.uk). A direct link will be set up shortly. If you would rather speak to a person then phone 0300 126 1000 between 8am and 6pm or 07000 782112 if it is an emergency outside these hours.

**SPEEDWATCH** - The village has signed up to have the speed guns again for a six-week period starting on 29<sup>th</sup> June. Please drive carefully through the village, as it is often locals in a hurry who get sent warning letters saying they were exceeding 30mph! We still need volunteers to train to use the speed gun, so please contact Nigel Gove (01788 891118) if you can spare an hour to help.

**EUROPEAN ELECTIONS Thursday 23rd May** - People living in Daventry District have until Tuesday, 7<sup>th</sup> May to register to vote in the European Parliamentary election scheduled to take place next month. Daventry District Council is making preparations for the polling day on Thursday, 23<sup>rd</sup> May following the latest agreement by the European Union and UK to extend the Brexit deadline to the end of October.

Residents are reminded that there are no local council elections in Daventry District on 2<sup>nd</sup> May after they were postponed by the Government for a year in the light of proposals to restructure councils in Northamptonshire. Any polling cards they receive will be for the European election only.

The deadline for registering to vote in time for the European parliamentary election is midnight on 7<sup>th</sup> May. Those registering to vote for the first time can do so online at [www.gov.uk/register tovote](http://www.gov.uk/register tovote). Anyone unsure if they are registered, or who has recently moved house should contact the Council's Electoral Services team on 01327 871100 or email [electoralservices@daventrydc.gov.uk](mailto:electoralservices@daventrydc.gov.uk) Postal vote applications need to be completed and sent to DDC's Electoral Registration Officer by 5pm on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> May.

Applications to vote by proxy (when somebody votes on your behalf) must be received by DDC's Electoral Registration Officer by 5pm on Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> May, though if an elector falls ill or is called away on business after that date, they may be able to apply up to 5pm on 23<sup>rd</sup> May. ## **Barby & Onley Parish Council Annual Report**

### **APRIL 2018 – MARCH 2019**

Dave Blezard was elected at Council Chairman in May but he has moved away from the area, so in October Dawn Cotton was elected as Chairman and Paul Reynolds became Vice-Chairman.

James Wood from Onley Grounds joined the Council to fill the vacant seat left by Howard Vale. There is currently a full compliment of 11 councillors who have another year to serve of their term before the next Parish Council elections which will take place in 2020.

Councillor Nigel Gove acts as Internal Financial Controller and has kept a close eye on the Parish finances checking all payments against invoices each month and providing help with the budget.

The Parish Council has increased its funding by 4.7%. The estimated spending for 2019/20 is £53,330 therefore, the Parish Council requested £2,511 more than last year to be collected via the Council Tax.

During the current financial year 2018/19 the Parish Council has had the surface of Barby Tennis Court painted and lined. We have secured a grant of £1,000 from Tesco towards outdoor fitness equipment for Barby Play Area. We also secured a £10,000 lottery grant which has enabled us to install new play equipment at Barby and to top up the safety surfacing.

We have also been successful in securing a District Council grant which will allow us to install outdoor fitness equipment at both Barby and Onley soon.

Despite a huge hike in the cost of Electricity supply, the LED street lighting upgrade carried out last year has helped to offset the increases. We have also installed a power supply on Barby Village Green and hope to be able to have better lights for the Christmas tree using the power.

The Parish Council will be installing 4 more street lights in particularly dark areas of the village very shortly. These are on order and we are awaiting an installation date.

Onley has had a new notice board and a commemorative WW1 bench seat, installed and repairs carried out to the fence around the play area.

The threat of a huge housing development at Lodge Farm, off A45 opposite Onley Park was fought and has been removed from Rugby's development plans.

Sadly, Onley Youth Club folded in September and the Parish Council have decided that there are insufficient youngsters at Onley wanting to attend to make it worthwhile employing a new youth worker at the current time.

We have carried out tree work around the parish, tidied up the pocket park next to Barby Primary School, put in a height barrier for the sports field in partnership with Barby Townlands Charity and Barby Cricket Club, taken on ownership of 3

grit bins which otherwise would have been removed by Northamptonshire County Council.

The Parish Council has arranged and paid for mowing of the grass verges and open space areas in the parish and has taken on responsibility for litter picking within 30mph limits from Daventry District Council.

Thanks to Councillor Cliff Jones for organising a village litter pick in March.

We have taken part in the Police Speedwatch initiative, and after many years of campaigning managed to get visits from the police speed camera van to monitor traffic speeds down Daventry road. Speedwatch will take place in the village again this year starting at the end of June.

In addition, we have kept up to date with all the latest legislation, and in particular had to comply with changes to the General Data Protection Regulations. We have upgraded the Council printer and have moved to online banking.

Thanks very much to the band of hard-working Councillors who make it all happen!

Thanks also to Ian Webb for his work as newsletter and website editor and for the improvements that he continues to make to our website, and to the young people who deliver the newsletter to every household. Thanks also to Dom Fisher who acts as Highway Warden on behalf of the Village. Mike Dalton who keeps the vehicle activated sign charged up and Baggy who picks up lots of litter, and the footpath wardens who walk our village paths and report and repair stiles etc.

### **PARISH COUNCIL ACCOUNTS**

Barby & Onley Parish Council financial year ends on 31 March. Barby & Onley accounts are particularly complicated as when the village of Onley Park was transferred to the Parish by the Ministry of Justice in 2005, a lump sum of £165,185 was also provided to cover maintenance of the Open Space land. This has to be ring-fenced for that purpose. At 31 March 2019 we had £103,464 of the ring-fenced money left.

### **For year 1 April 2018 to 31 March 2019**

#### **INCOME**

Precept £50,819 (this is the "precept" amount collected through the rates by Daventry District Council on behalf of the parish)

Other £25,552 (Grant of £9,980 from Awards for All, £11,717 VAT refund on the street light installation project which took place last year, £794 payment towards the cost of mowing from Northants County Council, bank interest, advertising income.

## EXPENDITURE

Maintenance of Onley Open Space £10,944 was paid out of ring-fenced money and covered the cost of mowing, weed-killing and tree works. All other expenditure is paid for from money raised through the rates, or from grants and referred to as general spend on the Bank Reconciliation sheet.

Parish Council accounts are scrutinised annually by an independent verifier who checks the figures, and also ensure that the Council is operating correctly and has the necessary policies, insurance and risk assessments in place. To ensure we comply with Governance and Accountability legislation the accounts are also reviewed annually by external auditors.

During the financial year 1<sup>st</sup> April 18 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 19 the areas where money was spent can be broken down as follows:-
