Parish Council News (From the Parish Clerk 01788 891184)

Parish Council Meetings - Barby & Onley Parish Council Meeting will take place on Monday 14th September 2020 at 7.30pm. Due to the current Government restrictions to maintain social distancing to reduce the spread of Coronavirus Covid-19 the meeting will be held via a video conference using zoom rather than in the Village Hall.

Joining instructions to attend the zoom meeting will be published on the agenda, and members of the parish are welcome to attend.

Elections in May 2021 - the term of office of our current Parish Councillors has been extended by a year due to the Covid-19 pandemic, which prevented elections taking place in May. The elections have been postponed until May 2021 so anyone who is keen to become a Parish Councillor will be able to have an opportunity to put their name forward in March 2021. Now is the time to find out what the role involves and have a chat to current councillors about it.

Planning for the Future - You may have heard on the news that the Government has published a white paper called **Planning for the Future**, which proposes radical changes to the planning and development control system in England. It is proposed that local plans are simplified to focus on identifying land under three categories

- Growth areas suitable for substantial development, and where outline approval would automatically be secured for development specified in the plan
- Renewal areas suitable for some development
- Protected areas where – as the name suggests – development is restricted.

The devil will be in the detail, but the Parish Council feel that this may be an opportune time to review our Parish Neighbourhood Development Plan, and make sure that it still protects the areas of the parish that we feel are important. Anyone who is keen to help review the Neighbourhood Development plan, then please contact the Parish Clerk clerk@barbyandonleyparishcouncil.co.uk so that we can arrange a review meeting.

Proposed extension to HMP Ryehill, Onley - A full planning application is to be submitted to Daventry District Council in September for works to HMP Rye Hill comprising the construction of a new house block and other ancillary facilities. The scheme is a re-consideration of that which was approved under planning application DA/2015/0945 in February 2016.

The planning consultants who are putting the application together are going to join the zoom Parish Council meeting on 14th September to explain their proposal and answer any questions that might arise.

Barby Flag Pole - In addition to the list printed in the last newsletter, the Royal Air Force Flag will be flown on Armed Forces Day, which is the last Saturday in June and also on "Battle of Britain Day" which is 15th September. It is 80 years since the Battle of Britain took place. Anyone wishing to fly a flag, please contact the Parish Clerk clerk@barbyandonleyparishcouncil.co.uk at least 6 weeks before you wish to fly it, so that it can be included on the Parish Council agenda and permission obtained.

Village Play Areas - Coronavirus Stopping the Spread

The new play equipment has had a lot of use, and is being enjoyed by lots of families which is great to see. Please remember to take extra hygiene precautions to ensure everyone stays safe. Thanks to Daventry District Council who provided £8,000 in match funding towards the new equipment.

Please remember that dogs are not allowed in the play areas.



Help Us Keep Things Clean - Parents, please ensure both you and your child maintain the 1m+ social distancing measures, as advised by the Government, at all times whilst using the play areas.

There is no assurance that the play equipment has been sanitised prior to your visit so we advise that you sanitise the area before and after you use it if possible. Wash your hands with soap and hot water for at least 20 seconds as soon as possible following your visit. Please ensure that you bring your own sanitiser with you.

If the Play Area is busy, then please consider coming back at a less crowded time and explain to your children in advance that you might have to do this.

NHS Test and Trace scams:

The NHS Test and Trace service plays an important role in the fight against coronavirus and it's vital the public have confidence and trust in the service. However, we understand the concerns people have about the opportunity for criminals to commit scams.

What you need to know:

Contact tracers will **only call you from the number** 0300 013 5000. Anyone who does not wish to talk over the phone can request the NHS Test and Trace service

to send an email or text instead, inviting them to log into the web-based service. All text or emails sent by NHS Test and Trace will ask people to sign into the contact tracing website and will provide you with a unique reference number. We would advise people to **type the web address** <https://contact-tracing.phe.gov.uk> **directly into their browser**, followed by the unique reference number given to you, rather than clicking on any link provided in the message. If you think you have been a victim of fraud, please report it to Action Fraud at <https://www.actionfraud.police.uk> or by calling 0300 123 2040.

Citizens Advice Daventry & District – The Citizens Advice Daventry and District is now offering face to face advice on Mondays and Wednesdays at their offices within The Abbey in Daventry.

To book an appointment phone 01327 701646, leave a voicemail with your name and phone number and they will call you back within two working days to complete your booking. In line with government guidelines they ask that face coverings are worn unless there is a valid exemption.
