**Parish Council Meetings** – The next meeting of the Barby & Onley Parish Council will take place on **Monday 8<sup>th</sup> March 2021** at 7.30pm. The meeting will be held via zoom online and joining instructions will be published on the front of the agenda which will be available on the parish website [www.barbyandonleyparishcouncil.co.uk](http://www.barbyandonleyparishcouncil.co.uk) and the noticeboards. Parishioners are welcome to attend the online meeting, and the first 20 minutes of the meeting will be open for public participation. If you have a concern which you would like to make the parish councillors aware of, then join the meeting and let them know about it. It may not be possible to provide an answer immediately, but the matter can be put on the agenda for the following meeting.

The Parish Council would like to thank Bridget Little for her time as a councillor. Sadly, she has had to resign as a councillor so the council will continue with 9 of the 11 seats filled until the election on 6<sup>th</sup> May, when hopefully we will have a full complement of Councillors again.

**Parish Council Elections** - All the current Parish Councillors reach the end of their term of office in May and 11 people are needed to form the new Parish Council.

# **Become a Parish Councillor**

If you would like to become a Parish Councillor, then you need to complete a nomination pack, which can be obtained and printed from the Electoral Commission website <https://www.electoralcommission.org.uk/media/5016>. The pack can also be downloaded from the councillors elections page on the Parish Council website <http://bit.ly/bopcelections2021>

The elections to be held on Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> May are for both Barby & Onley Parish Council and also the new West Northamptonshire Council Unitary Authority. A zoom briefing session (covering both elections) will held on Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> March for anyone wishing to find out more about how to stand as a councillor. The

briefing will be held virtually at 5.30pm and, once they receive notification that you wish to attend, they will send you the invitation to join the meeting. The session will be recorded and available on YouTube later for those unable to attend. It would be preferable to attend the zoom session as you can ask questions that you may not find the answers to on the recording. Completed nomination papers must be hand-delivered to Daventry District Council Offices by 4.00pm on Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> April 2021. Please note that to fill in the form, you need a proposer and seconder from the parish, and you have to include their name and electoral roll number. Your electoral roll number can be obtained from the DDC's election office 01327 302321.

**Annual Parish Meeting** - This is a meeting of the parish, which is hosted by the Parish Council but is **not** a Parish Council meeting. It should be held between 1<sup>st</sup> March and 1<sup>st</sup> June but, last year, it was cancelled due to the Covid-19 pandemic. We will try to set up an online Annual Parish Meeting to provide you with a summary of what the Parish Council has done during the past year and provide updates on the change over to the Unitary Authority. The date for the meeting will be arranged at the next Parish Council meeting and will take place in April prior to the local election when we will have a new set of councillors in place.

**Census 2021** - will provide a snapshot of modern society

Households across Barby & Onley will soon be asked to take part in Census 2021. The census is a once-in-a-decade survey that gives us the most accurate estimate of all the people and households in England and Wales. It has been carried out every 10 years since 1801, except 1941.

It will be the first one to run predominantly online, with households receiving a letter with a unique access code, allowing them to complete the questionnaire on their computers, phones or tablets.

"A successful census will ensure everyone from local government to charities can put services and funding in the places where they are most needed," Iain Bell, deputy national statistician at the Office for National Statistics, said.

"This could mean things like doctors' surgeries, schools and new transport routes. That's why it is so important everyone takes part and we have made it easier for people to do so online on any device, with help and paper questionnaires for those that need them."

Census day will be on March 21<sup>st</sup>, but households across the country will receive letters with online codes allowing them to take part from early March.

The census will include questions about your sex, age, work, health, education, household size and ethnicity. And, for the first time, there will be a question asking people whether they have served in the armed forces, as well as voluntary questions for those aged 16 and over on sexual orientation and gender identity. Results will be available within 12 months, although personal records will be locked away for 100 years, kept safe for future generations.

**Highway Works** - New safety barriers are going to be installed on the roads that cross the M45 at the beginning of February. Due to the recent cold weather the dates for installing the new barriers are now:

**Barby, Hillmorton Lane**      *22<sup>nd</sup> February 2021 to 12<sup>th</sup> March*

**Nortoft Lane**                      *15<sup>th</sup> March to 2<sup>nd</sup> April*

Signed diversion routes will be in place and access to businesses will remain available during these times.

Any **potholes** you come across can be reported to Northamptonshire Highways for repair via [www.fixmystreet.com](http://www.fixmystreet.com) or telephone 0300 126 1000 8am to 6pm Mon to Friday or 07000 782112 outside those hours.

You will be provided with a reference number for your report so that you can go back and check what is being done to rectify the problem.

**Street Lights** - Please report any faulty street lights to the clerk (01788 891184 or email [clerk@barbyandonleyparishcouncil.co.uk](mailto:clerk@barbyandonleyparishcouncil.co.uk)). **Defibrillators** - can be found at Onley Park's red phone box, and at Barby Village Hall. If you suspect someone of having a heart attack, phone 999 and the ambulance service will tell you where the nearest defibrillator is situated, and what to do to give the person the best chance of recovery. The defibrillator unit has clear instructions, so anyone can use it if necessary. Don't be frightened to use it, as it cannot do any further harm to anyone but it may just help save their life.

**Japanese Cherry Trees** - Barby & Onley Parish has been chosen as one of the villages in Northamptonshire to receive a gift from the Japanese Embassy of 10 Sakura Cherry Trees. The hope is that there will be pockets of Japanese Cherry blossom in villages across the country that will look wonderful in the spring. Some of the trees will be planted in the orchard area at Onley and some in Barby.

"Necessity is the mother of invention" so the saying goes and, heaven knows, we've needed to be inventive in the past year to make our lives as tolerable as possible.

Many of us have had to embrace technology to maintain contact with friends, family and vital services; many have turned their hands to things creative discovering talents they didn't know they possessed.

Those in the vanguard of keeping things going at Rugby's Percival Guildhouse, the only independent adult education centre in Warwickshire, have had to be adaptable and resourceful.

From a standing start last March, where no classes were run online, they have launched most courses online via Zoom, with only those that physically cannot operate virtually being suspended until the doors at St Matthew's Street can open to students again.

All eyes are now focussed on the Summer Term, which starts in April and runs through to early July. Initially, all existing and several new courses that can be will be run online. But with positive hopes for better times as we move towards summer proper, the popular day schools are being moved to late June (19<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>) by which time, hopefully, students can meet in person – safely distanced, of course.

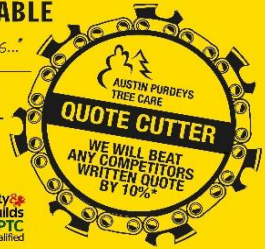
