

Parish Council Meetings – The Parish Council continue to meet on the second Monday of each month. The next meetings will take place on Monday 12th December and Monday 9th January at 7.30pm at Barby Village Hall. Members of the parish are welcome to join the meeting and raise any issues they wish during the period of public participation at the beginning of the meeting.

<u>New Parish Councillor</u> - The Parish Council is pleased to welcome new Parish Councillor Phillip Wagg to the Parish Council, who was co-opted at the November meeting. There is still one vacancy and full details can be obtained from the Clerk for anyone interested in becoming a Parish Councillor. No qualifications or experience is necessary and full training will be given. The only criteria to meet is as follows:

- British or a citizen of the Commonwealth or European Union
- At least 18 years old
- Either on the list of electors for the parish, or during the whole of the previous twelve months has:
- · Occupied land in the parish as an owner or tenant or
- · Had a principal place of work in the parish or
- Resided in, or within three miles, of the parish.

<u>Street Lighting</u> - If you notice a streetlight which isn't working please contact the Clerk by phone or email (details given above).

<u>West Northampton Council (WNC) Change of Offices</u> - The planning department of West Northamptonshire Council is due to move to Towcester. There will also be some changes for other departments in Daventry with the relocation of staff from their Lodge Road offices. <u>**Budget</u></u> - The Parish Council will be agreeing it's budget and setting the precept at its meeting on 12th December. Full details of the budget will be published on the website, once agreed.</u>**

<u>Merry Christmas</u> - The Parish Council would like to wish all residents of Barby and Onley as very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year!

The Parish Clerk will be on leave from 16th December until 3rd January. For any urgent matters you can contact the Clerk by email and an alternative emergency contact will be given. Please note that West Northamptonshire Council have details of their Christmas opening times on their website.

<u>Christmas waste and recycling arrangements across West Northants</u> - Waste and recycling collection crews will be working throughout the festive season to make sure services are delivered on time and with no delays. Downloadable Christmas and New Year bin calendars will be available from the Council's website at www.westnorthants.gov.uk/bins-recycling-and-waste.

However, the main things to remember with regards to Barby and Onley are

- The main collection days will not be affected this year
- Garden waste collections will be suspended from 24th December until 6th January across West Northants.

Crews will collect real Christmas trees between 9th and 20th January. You should put real Christmas trees out on the day that garden waste is due to be collected. You do not need a garden waste subscription to put out your real Christmas tree, but please ensure that any over 6ft are cut in half. Additional recycling can be put out in clear plastic bags or boxes alongside recycling bins and boxes or can also be taken to the Household Waste Recycling Centre at Browns Lane, Daventry. It will be open as usual except for Christmas Day, Boxing Day & New Year's Day, when it will be closed. It will also close early on Christmas Eve, at 2.00pm.
