<u>In Memory of HM The Queen</u> – Barby & Onley Parish Council are deeply saddened by the loss of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. The Queen gave a lifetime of service and was an inspiration to us all. The example she has set will leave a lasting legacy. We are grateful for the Barby and Onley community that embodies much of what we admired in Her Majesty with so many residents who regularly devote their time to helping those around them.

<u>Councillor Vacancy</u> - The parish council still has a vacancy for a parish councillor and would welcome applications from anyone who could give a little of their time and would like to make a difference to their community.

<u>Planning -</u> The parish council is a consultee on planning applications in Barby and Onley and considers new applications at its monthly meetings. West Northamptonshire Council is the deciding authority and full details of all planning applications can be found on their website:

<u>Hedges</u> - The hedges have now been cut back around the Barby play area and the parish council is very grateful to the local resident who freely gave their time to carry this out.

<u>Street lights</u> - As it becomes darker earlier you may become more aware of the street lights in the parish. If you spot a problem with any of the street lights in either Barby or Onley please report it to the Clerk.

<u>Flooding</u> - Following issues with flooding in the parish, the parish council applied to become part of the Pathfinder Project run by West Northants Council. The project investigates causes of flooding in the area and identifies ways to address it. A grant is also offered under the scheme to fund works required to build flood resilience. As the parish council embarks on this project they are seeking volunteers who have some knowledge of the local area and an interest in helping

to prevent flooding. Ideally, the council would like to have four flood wardens and full training will be given. West Northants Council describe the role as follows:

"Flood Wardens can help local communities to understand their flood risk and that they all have a responsibility to look after themselves, their family and property and to prepare before, during and after a flood.

Flood Wardens are the eyes and ears of the community. Whether they are out walking their dog or just walking to the shop they can keep an eye out for blocked drains and culverts, tree branches in rivers, and anything else that may cause a flood risk and report them to the appropriate land or property owners."
