<u>Parish Council Meetings</u> – The next Meeting of Barby & Onley Parish Council will take place on MONDAY 12TH SEPTEMBER at 7.30pm in **Onley Village Hall**.

<u>Councillor Vacancy</u> - West Northamptonshire Council have notified the Parish Council that the latest vacancy for a councillor can now be filled by co-option. Alternatively have a chat with one of the current councillors (their contact details can be found on page 7 of this newsletter or on the website) about the commitment involved. Training for the role is provided.

<u>Planning</u> - The Parish Council is a consultee on planning applications in Barby and Onley and consider new applications at its monthly meetings. West Northamptonshire Council is the deciding authority and full details of all planning applications can be found on their website:

<u>Hedges</u> - The Parish Council will be addressing overgrown hedges around the play area in Barby as soon as it is able to, given the restrictions of the nesting season. Please can residents check that any hedges they own are not impinging onto footpaths and arrange to have these cut back where necessary.

<u>Play Areas</u> - The Parish Council has had a detailed annual risk assessment carried out on the play areas in Barby and Onley and will be addressing any issues reported. One of the swings in the Barby play area has been identified as posing a risk and has been removed but will be replaced with a new swing soon.

<u>LED Street Lights in Onley</u> - As part of the Parish Council's ongoing commitment to taking positive action to address climate change, the street lights at Onley have recently been upgraded to LED lights. These lights will be more energy efficient and reduce the Parish Council's expenditure on electricity compared to the old street lights.

If you spot a problem with any of the street lights in either Barby or Onley, please report it to the Parish Clerk.

<u>Crime Prevention</u> - Northamptonshire Neighbourhood Alert have been sending out advice from the police on how to prevent crime, particularly burglaries over recent months. A recent message containing some useful advice:

"In Northamptonshire, the numbers of burglaries have reduced significantly since we launched Operation Crooked in 2019, however the team continues working at pace to decrease those numbers even further.

Burglars are often opportunistic thieves who prey on houses and flats. They seek out any opening that they can take advantage of, specifically doors and windows that are left open or unlocked or are easy to force. Anything of value that they might spot through a window will only spur them on. But it really doesn't take much to deter these thieves – just smart thinking.

Please take a look at the below five facts about burglary to give you the best chance of protecting your home from burglars.

- Burglars target homes that they think will contain valuables. A sure giveaway is leaving packaging from expensive items outside your front door
- Burglars often look for homes with windows or doors left open or with vulnerable features that they can exploit
- Burglars are aware of the times when someone is expected to be away from their house such as during the school run or holidays. Don't advertise that you are going to be away on social media
- Burglars typically do not want to be seen or heard and if they see crime prevention technology like CCTV cameras or video doorbells, they are more likely to move on
- Sheds and garages are often vulnerable as they are not that secure and contain tools which the burglar can use to assist them to gain entry to a home. Make sure they're locked and nothing of significant value is inside them
