Parish Council News (Parish Clerk 07864 579068)

<u>Parish Council Meetings</u> – The Parish Council continues to meet on the second Monday of each month. The next meeting will take place on Monday 13th February at 7.30pm at Barby Village Hall. Members of the parish are welcome to join the meeting and raise any issues they wish during the period of public participation at the beginning of the meeting.

Community Defibrillator Seminar - The Parish Council is arranging a Community Defibrillator Seminar to be held at Onley Village Hall to be run by the Community Heartbeat Trust. It is hoped that a date in March will be agreed, and it will be advertised on the Parish Council website and on the Parish Council noticeboards as soon as it is confirmed. The Community Heartbeat Trust will be demonstrating the use of defibrillators and explaining how the equipment works and its benefits to the community in saving precious minutes in the treatment of sudden cardiac arrest. The more people that know how to use the portable defibrillator, installed in our community, the more chance there is of saving the life of a victim of sudden cardiac arrest. Everybody is welcome, and no special skills are required, just your willingness to play an important role in the event of a medical emergency.

<u>Parish Councillor Vacancy -</u> There is still one vacancy and full details can be obtained from the Clerk for anyone interested in becoming a Parish Councillor. No qualifications or experience is necessary and full training will be given. The only criteria to meet is as follows:

- British or a citizen of the Commonwealth or European Union
- At least 18 years old
- Either on the list of electors for the parish, or during the whole of the previous twelve months has:
- · Occupied land in the parish as an owner or tenant
- Had a principal place of work in the parish
- Resided in, or within three miles, of the parish.

<u>Planning</u> - The Parish Council is a consultee on planning applications in Barby and Onley and considers new applications at its monthly meetings. West Northamptonshire Council is the deciding authority and full details of all planning applications can be found on their website:

Barby and Onley Neighbourhood Plan Review

The Localism Act of 2011 has given Parish Councils the power to shape what their communities will look like in the future.

Barby and Onley Parish Council made the decision to take on these new powers and to prepare what is known as a 'Neighbourhood Plan'. The Plan was formally 'made' by Daventry District Council (now a part of West Northamptonshire Council) in September 2016 and covers issues to do with the scale of housing locally, the mix of housing in the parish, numerous environmental protections, policies shaping, the development of employment sites and the safeguarding of community facilities. The Plan is now used by West Northamptonshire Council to determine planning applications in the parish. The current plan is available at https://www.barbyandonleyparishcouncil.co.uk/Neighbourhood Plan 7061.aspx Since it was made, there have been numerous changes to planning legislation including a new Daventry Local Plan (2020) and National Planning Policy Framework (2021) which sets the overall planning strategy for England. It is therefore necessary to formally review our Neighbourhood Plan, to make sure it remains locally appropriate and in line with the changing strategic planning policy framework.

The Parish Council has started this process and is inviting all residents to come along to drop-in sessions on Saturday 18th March at Barby Village Hall (10.00am to 11.30 am) and Onley Park Village Hall (12.00 to 1.30pm) to find out about the Neighbourhood Plan and to let us know what you think are the priorities for development in the parish in the future. You will be able to find out how you can become involved and help to manage development in the parish in the coming years. Please come along at any time, at either venue, and share your thoughts so that the Neighbourhood Plan remains an important tool for shaping development in the parish in line with local needs rather than wider West Northamptonshire priorities. Parish Council Draft Budget 2023/24 Summary

The Parish Council Budget reflects the significant difficulties of coping with rising costs and high expected inflation pressures (particularly for the cost of electricity used for Street lighting) while at the same time recognising the cost-of-living impact on people's finances.

The forecast is showing we will have a small projected overspend for this year (2022/2023) and a bigger estimated deficit for the following year. The budget for 2023/24 is not balanced meaning we will need to dip into our reserves. The Parish Council after much deliberation has proposed a 3% precept increase for the new Budget year. Precept is the income the Parish Council receives from its portion of the total District Council tax.

Forecast expenditure this year is £61,408 compared to the precept income of £60,483 leaving us with a potential £925 overspend. If this materialises the deficit will be taken from our reserve account. The Budget forecast expenditure next year (2023/24) is £65,605 which is an increase of £5,122 over this year's precept.

The Parish Council proposal is to fund a significant portion of this shortfall from general reserves and increase the precept by 3.0% to absorb the remaining shortfall. The Parish Council is able to absorb this shortfall as a result of sound

management of its finances over past years allowing us to build sufficient reserves for difficult circumstances like we currently face. This equates to an increase in the Barby & Onley precept of £1,814 and a reduction to general reserves of £3,308. In total we may have to use up to £4,233 of our reserves over the next two years. As a result, a Band D Council tax property which is currently £2,062 per year will see the Barby & Onley Parish Council element of £120 per year increase by £3.60 per year or 30p a month.

The budget team will continue to review expenditure over the coming year to find ways of managing our way through this difficult time. By way of note, to balance the budget we would need an increase of 5.8%.


