<u>Parish Council Meetings</u>. The Parish Council continue to meet on the second Monday of each month except when it falls on a bank holiday. The next meeting will take place on Monday 12th June at 7.30pm at Barby Village Hall. Members of the parish are welcome to join the meeting and raise any issues they wish during the period of public participation at the beginning of the meeting.

<u>Annual Meetings</u> Thank you to everyone who attended the Annual Parish Meeting in April and a special thank you to everyone who gave a report on behalf of their village group or organisation.

The Annual Parish Council Meeting was held on Monday 15th May. Paul Reynolds was re-elected as Chairman of the Parish Council and Steven Gee was re-elected as Vice-Chairman. The Parish Council currently has a full complement of Parish Councillors but there are other voluntary roles available for anyone that is interested in supporting the work of the Parish Council. Please contact the Parish Clerk for more information. The Parish Council decided that it will continue to hold meetings on the second Monday of each month. The meetings for the year will be held at Barby Village Hall, except in November 2023 and May 2024 when meetings will be held at Onley Village Hall.

<u>Website</u> We continually review and update the village website to make sure that information is current. If any village groups or organisations would like to update their information or contact details please email the Parish Clerk.

<u>Footpath Warden</u> The Parish Council would be interested to hear from anyone who would like to take on the voluntary role of footpath warden.

Responsibilities include:

- Be aware of rules and regulations for Public Rights of Way
- Be familiar with the Definitive Map
- Survey all paths in the parish annually
- Carry out path inspections
- Waymark routes
- Carry out minor vegetation clearance and minor repairs
- Encourage parishioners to use paths to keep them walkable
- Act as contact for local enquiries about footpaths
- Maintain contact with the WNC Footpaths Officer
- Liaise with landowners
- Seek advice as appropriate from CPRE and The Ramblers
- Report to Parish Council on Rights of Way issues

In carrying out these duties, the Footpaths Warden is covered by Parish Council public liability insurance as a volunteer working on behalf of the Parish Council. <u>Litter Picker</u> The Parish Council would like to hear from anyone interested in collecting litter in Barby on a regular basis for the monthly sum of £40. Litter picking equipment is provided by the Parish Council. Please contact the Parish Clerk for more details.

Chairman's Report for 2022-23

We currently have a full complement of 11 councillors. Thank you to all those who take on the role of Councillor to try and ensure our parish is a great place to live, as we all know it is an entirely voluntary role and each councillor gives up some of their spare time for the community to make decisions that we feel benefits us all. In 2022 I was appointed once more as Chairman at the Parish Council AGM for my 3rd year, with Steve Gee as Vice-Chair. Councillor Nigel Gove has continued his role as Internal Financial Controller for the Council. During the year Sadie Milligan and Rachael Kilby had to step down from the role of Councillor and we have welcomed Councillors Phil Wagg and Jane Pollard who were co-opted into their vacant seats.

Katrina Jones started in 2022 as Locum Clerk following the retirement of Catherine Camp. Late in 2022 following a recruitment drive we were delighted to appoint Katrina to the permanent position. She has settled in well to the council with quite a few complicated projects being undertaken over the past year.

We are very fortunate to have a large number of volunteers in addition to the Councillors and my thanks on behalf of all the community goes out to them. During the year we have had a few changes with Ian Webb having retired as Parish newsletter and website editor. Christine Dover has now taken over as the newsletter editor and Katrina is taking over as website editor. A huge thank you to all of Ian's hard work and help over the many years he's supported the Parish Council.

Dom Fisher has continued as Highways Liaison and Neighbourhood Watch Co-Ordinator. Our Footpath Warden Alan Atkinson has stood down during the year and we are still looking for a volunteer to fill this role.

Gavin Callard has again given a lot of his time at Onley helping with lots of things in the community – thank you from everyone at Onley who I know value his contributions.

A notable thanks once again goes to all the volunteers who help litter pick a few times a year, this is always well supported and makes a big different to the villages and surrounding countryside. Thank you to all the others who give their time to also help out who I haven't named directly.

Whilst nothing to do with the Parish Council, The Arnold arms opened again after a long period of closure and neglect. The village has welcomed Jeremy and Lorraine Baker with great enthusiasm and it's great to see the pub very much back at the heart of the community and thriving.

Finances

The Parish Council Precept is the only part of your Council Tax that you can be assured is being directly spent on you and not procured into a distant area of the West Northamptonshire. It is a tiny percentage of your overall Council Tax bill and you can be assured it will be spent for your benefit and in your Parish. In December the Parish Council set a budget and requested a precept of £62,300 for the year which commenced on the 1st April 2023. This was a 3% rise over the previous year which is way below the inflationary pressures we have all faced. We feel confident in our decision to make this low increase due to very prudent and responsible

management of our finances over many years.

Parish Council accounts are scrutinised annually by an independent verifier who checks the figures and also checks that the council is operating correctly and has the necessary policies, insurance and risk assessments in place. To ensure that we comply with governance and accountability legislation the accounts are also reviewed annually by external auditors

Since the start of 2022 we have all faced a period of rapid inflation caused by monetary policies over the Covid period and of course the awful war in Ukraine. The parish council has tried to find ways to manage the costs wisely and some of these include:

- We are in the process of investing ring-fenced money from Onley Open Spaces fund into a high interest business account, this will make best use of recent interest rate rises and to help preserve its future value
- We have installed LED street lighting at Onley Park which completed our transition to fully LED street lights within our control. With the sharp rise in energy costs these decisions have been an important factor in us being able to maintain healthy finances in the current climate.

<u>Planning</u> - The Parish Council acts as a consultee in the planning process for any applications within our Parish, we have no direct influence, but we act in the interests of those most directly affected and carefully consider our comments based on this. Ultimately decisions on whether planning consent will be granted or not is made by the Daventry Area Planning Authority and we welcome working closer with them over the coming years with the support of our Unitary Councillors. This year the parish has been consulted on 23 planning applications. An application of great interest to the community to extend the shooting hours and facilities at Barby Sporting Club has still not gone before the planning committee after a period well in excess of 12 months.

Some of our achievements though the year - We have very few members of the public who attend our Parish Council meetings and despite the Parish Newsletter being distributed to all households and each meeting having minutes available online, it is easy to miss some of the achievements we have made through the year and how we have tried to help and benefit the communities, so I have summarised some of these here:

Some of our achievements and notable events include:

New Jubilee Commemorative benches have been installed in Barby and Onley.
These were funded by a grant from the Lottery Heritage Fund. An old bench
from Daventry Road was restored and installed as an additional bench in Barby
Play Area.

- The Parish Council have taken over looking after the War Memorial in Barby after a village volunteer retired, this was last year re-pointed by Billy Dickenson at no charge.
- The Parish tree survey has been recently updated and work will soon be carried out on trees identified which require safety works.
- Play Areas in both villages have been repaired and maintained. New play bark is imminently due to arrive in time for the summer period at Barby.
- Purchased additional litter picking kits for volunteer use on regular village litter picks in and around the village boundaries
- The broadband connection at Barby Village has been replaced by a new high speed Gigaclear connection. The first 12 months of this has been provided free of charge by Gigaclear for the benefit of the community. We have purchased additional boosters to ensure fast coverage throughout the large building.
- We chose a 'village flag' for Barby from a number of options presented to us from members of the community. A flag has been commissioned and is due to imminently arrive to be flown on the flag pole in Barby
- September as normal saw the trimming of the hedges around the play area and allotments once the birds had finished nesting. This has been done for many years by a local farmer who kindly gives up his time for free.
- The Council has agreed terms on long term lease of land at Onley from the MOJ which has been used and maintained by the community for many years.

Looking to the future

- In July and August of 2023 year volunteers from the Village will take part in Community Speedwatch once again. This is again being organised by Cllr Gove and his team of helpers. It has been a great success for many years and helps highlight the speeding issue we have in Barby.
- We are implementing a new accounting software package which will give us quicker access to financials so that we can better monitor our spend vs the budgets we have set throughout the year.
- The council is still progressing with traffic calming measures on Daventry Road
 which have been extensively delayed by the bureaucracy and inefficiencies of
 WNC and their highways contract. The highways department are currently
 conducting a feasibility and budget report on options available to us so we can
 make a decision on how to proceed.
- Flooding Pathfinder project Councillors O'Reilly and James have been
 working on this and we are currently progressing options to help alleviate some
 highlighted pinch points on Daventry Road and make use of available grant
 funding.
- In May we witnessed the Coronation of King Charles III following the death of Queen Elizabeth II aged 96 in September 2022. A village event was organised

by volunteers and a grant application is in process for various things such as planters and picnic benches. A commemorative tree will be planted on The Ware in Barby.

- The exciting new project for a community woodland and wildflower meadow on 23 acres of land adjacent to the sports ground is progressing well. "Barby Woodland Trust" Charity has been formed with the lease set to commence in mid 2023. Additional fundraising for this project will start shortly with more details and publicity imminent. Planting of the new trees is due to commence in November 2023
- We are currently reviewing our Neighbourhood Development Plan which an
 extensive and time consuming project led by Cllr Gorman. The goal is to give
 us every opportunity to protect development in the parish for the future in line
 with what the community wants. As a step in this process we have recently held
 a well-attended public consultation at Barby and Onley. The ability for us to do
 this was by way of a full grant which will cover the costs for our consultants and
 other expenditure.

Neighbourhood Plan Review - 'Call for sites' information

As we hope everyone knows, Barby and Onley Parish Council is in the process of reviewing its Neighbourhood Plan. As part of this process, we are considering taking advantage of new Government powers which ensure that the policies in the neighbourhood plan remain active and will continue to be used by West Northamptonshire Council to determine planning applications in the Parish, even in circumstances where the Local Plan cannot offer any protection.

To utilise these powers, the neighbourhood plan is considering allocating land for small-scale and locally appropriate residential development within the Parish. This may, for example, be for bungalows to meet the needs of older residents, or small family homes for young couples.


