There are a number of areas such as outside the pub and shop in Barby where pavement parking is posing a problem, despite car park spaces available nearby, and is causing pedestrians to walk into the road when pavements are blocked.

#### Download the free West Northants app.





Residents across West Northamptonshire are encouraged to download our free West Northants app to help them access information about bin collections, council services and more.

The easy-to-use app allows users to set up automatic alerts to remind them to put their bins out, and also features a handy recycling guide to help people recycle or dispose of their waste in the correct way. Users also receive notifications and alerts if there are any service changes in their area, such as disruption due to snow, or collection changes over the Christmas period. The app allows people to keep upto-date with Council news, find the opening times and locations of local facilities such as car parks, household waste and recycling centres, and public toilets. Local food businesses and their hygiene ratings are also listed.

The app has been in operation across the Daventry and South Northants areas for some time, but has recently been extended to include Northampton too.

With more features being developed in the coming months, the app will continue to expand to meet the needs of residents. It is free to download and use, people can find it by searching for 'West Northamptonshire Council' on the app store on your mobile or tablet. The app is available for both Android and Apple devices.

**Neighbourhood Plan.** As you are aware, Barby and Onley Parish Council is reviewing its neighbourhood plan. Thank you to all of you who attended the open events in the Parish on 18 March. There was an excellent turn out with 91 people attending from our two villages and a further 55 comments made electronically by those who were unable to attend on the day making a total of 149 contributions.

As part of this process, we are considering taking advantage of new Government powers which ensure that the policies in the neighbourhood plan remain active and will continue to be used by West Northamptonshire Council to determine planning applications in the Parish, even in circumstances where the Local Plan cannot offer any protection.

To utilise these powers, the neighbourhood plan is considering allocating land for small-scale and locally appropriate residential development within the Parish. This may, for example, be for bungalows to meet the needs of older residents, or small family homes for young couples.

Whilst it was clear from the open events that residents are opposed to large scale development in the Parish, there was support for smaller more locally appropriate house building where it meets a local need.

Before the Parish Council makes a decision about this, it is making contact with all landowners in the Parish with land within or close to the built-up area to invite expressions of interest for small-scale and well-designed development which is in keeping with the character of Barby and Onley. If you know of any local landowners, we would be grateful if you could bring this notice to their attention so that we don't miss anyone out. If you are a landowner yourself and are considering developing a part of your land for small-scale housing, then please let the Parish Council know and we will explain the process to you.

Once this exercise has been completed and we understand better the aspirations of local landowners, we will consider whether or not to formally assess each site with a view to making a small-scale allocation of the most suitable site through the neighbourhood plan. It remains a possibility at this stage that no suitable site will come forward and if so, the process will not be taken any further.

The extra powers available to the neighbourhood plan would apply where West Northamptonshire Council cannot demonstrate that it has sufficient new homes to meet its independently assessed need over a period of 5 years. Whilst this is not currently the case, there is no guarantee that this will continue to be so in the coming months and years.

We will let you, as residents, know how this process unfolds in the coming months and you will have further opportunity to comment on this and all neighbourhood plan policies prior to finalising the document and submitting it to West Northamptonshire Council.
