The only independent adult education centre in Rugby, the Guildhouse was created as a tribute to the memory of Dr John Percival, a pioneer in adult education, who had been headmaster at Rugby School from 1887 to 1895. The Guildhouse was formally opened on 29 September 1925 and has been providing arts and crafts classes to generations of adults ever since. The Mayor commented: "Heritage Open Day shone a light for me on all the treasures we have in Rugby, places such as the Guildhouse which have a fascinating past but also remain a very active and vibrant part of Rugby's story today." 
