<u>West Northants Council Boundary Review</u> The Local Government Boundary Commission has announced its final recommendations for West Northamptonshire following its consultation on its initial proposals. The recommendations include reducing the number of councillors for West Northants Council from 93 to

Single Planning System Launch A new single planning system has been launched across West Northamptonshire, providing access to applications, documents and associated information all in one place. Previously, planning information was hosted on three separate sites for the former local authority areas. Following over twelve months of migration, delivered across a phase approach all information has been new transferred into one new cloud based WNC planning system. All WNC planning applications, and their associated documents can now be accessed and viewed by the public in one location via the West Northants website or directly at https://wnc.planning-register.co.uk/


